

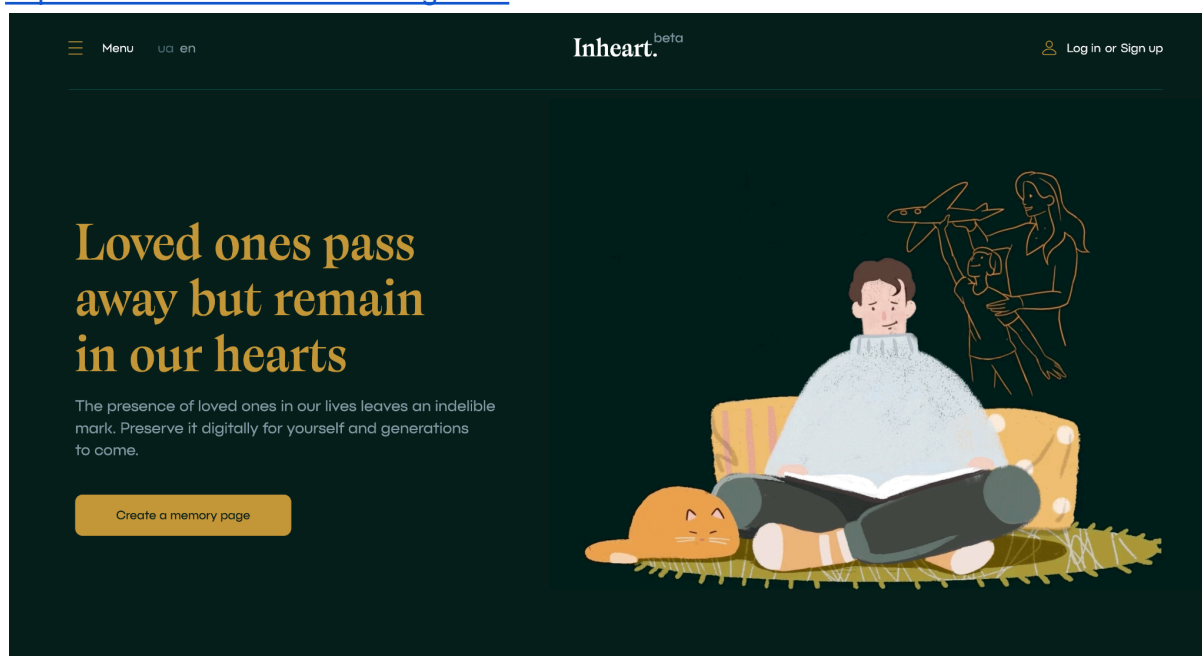
In EU, a free platform called Inheart has been launched for preserving the eternal memory of deceased loved ones, to be presented at Web Summit 2024

A free platform [Inheart](https://www.inheart.memorial/eng/main) (from English - "in the heart") has appeared in EU, which allows you to store memories of deceased loved ones. The team behind Inheart will also be presenting the platform at Web Summit 2024 to showcase its mission and impact.

This platform becomes a place where album photos, videos, letters, and other personal memories of the deceased are unified on a single page.

Advantages of the platform:

- **Data Security.** Information about the deceased is stored on multiple servers in different countries, increasing data archiving reliability.
- **Burial Location.** The developers have ensured the ability to transmit burial location with great precision. Thus, platform users can easily share the coordinates of the memorial's location with their relatives or friends for easy finding.

How to use the platform?

You need to create a memorial page and fill in the basic information. After that, you should share the link to this profile with the friends of the deceased so that they can choose to write warm words if they wish or add shared photos or videos that the family of the deceased may not have.

Upon creating the page, the user receives a QR code from the developers, which can be placed at the gravesite, offering a gentle way to fondly reminisce about the meaningful moments from the departed's life.



What are the plans for the platform's development?

Currently, there is ongoing development of a separate module to preserve the memory of Ukrainian defenders who have lost their lives in the full-scale war against Russia.

"When a loved one passed away, I found myself shouldering all the funeral-related tasks. Many aspects in this sphere seemed outdated and illogical to me. Some of them could and should be digitalised. For example, memory of a deceased person. This is how the project idea was born. Now, everybody will be able to preserve memories of their loved ones in one safe and convenient place," commented Alexander Sidorov, the founder of the Inheart platform
